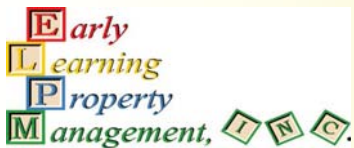

ELPM CENTER ACCOMPLISHMENTS



In addition to high quality educational child care, listed below are a few of the ELPM provider center accomplishments or services provided to the enrolled young children and their families over the past 12 years:

- ELPM early learning centers are NAEYC accredited, or equivalent, offering developmentally appropriate learning programs, toys, music and learning to read programs.
- Approximately 15,000,000+ meals were served throughout the day to children who would not ordinarily receive them.
- Approximately 8,000 immunizations given to enrolled children.
- Approximately 1000+ parent training hours.
- Media centers and family resource rooms in each center are special informational resources for books, magazines, music and family games available for check-out to the community to encourage "at home" educational nurturing.
- Centers offer community outreach programs, such as parenting classes, health and nutrition awareness, adult education, and English as a second language.
- Head Start Family and Early Childhood Education Services at no cost to eligible families.
- Georgia Pre-K Early Childhood Education available at no cost to 4 year olds.
- Extended day services to assist families with childcare so they are able to work.
- Infant/toddler scholarships to qualified families.
- Program transitions working with public schools to ensure smooth transition for children and families.
- Educational and special needs partnerships with local school districts.

Faced With an Epidemic, Children's Leads Campaign to Stop Childhood Obesity

As a national leader in pediatric health care, our doctors and nurses are seeing more and more children with diseases once seen only in adults—such as hypertension, liver and kidney disease and Type 2 diabetes.

Why?

- Georgia has the 2nd highest childhood obesity rate in the U.S.
- Nearly 40% of Georgia's children are overweight or obese.
